Preservation of Elkstones' Historical Resources from Jill

Good news! Elkstones has been awarded a grant by the South West Peak Partnership and the Heritage Lottery Fund to help us preserve our historical resources for future generations.

Following the success of our two village books, it's become clear that there is a great deal of interest in the history of Elkstones and that there are still more photos and documents out there which help us to put together the village's past.

To make sure that nothing is lost or wasted, it is our intention to create a website which will have a link to all the information we have so far. This will include a digitised version of the two existing books, the many photographs that we didn't have enough space for, all past newsletters and any new information that can be added at any time.

The website will also be a vehicle to share information such as upcoming events, items for sale, requests for information etc. It isn't intended as a replacement for the newsletter though. Where would we be without that?

To access the grant money, we need some cash upfront and to raise extra funds to match the amount we've been awarded. That means lots of fund-raising activities so any ideas (and offers ! – Ed) will be gratefully received.

If anyone would like to sponsor the project by making a donation - big or small - or advertising their business on the website, please let us know. We're also planning a table-top sale the first weekend of August, prompted by the mammoth decluttering effort made by the SEWING group, so if you have "stuff" you want to get rid of, this will be your opportunity.
