St. John's Church, Elkstones

If another 2 people willing to do 2 months came forward to help, that would be wonderful, or better still, if more people volunteered, everyone could do a shorter stint. It is not an onerous task, and can usually be done in an hour, once or at most twice, in the month, depending on when there is going to be a service.



What is involved? Dusting the pews, vacuuming the carpets and polishing the few pieces of brass and woodwork. Oh, and putting in some fresh flowers when needed. At Christmas, Easter, Harvest and Wakes,

it is usually a joint effort. If you want to be rewarded, just read the Visitors' Book to see how your work is appreciated. Any offers? The current vacant months are June, July, October and November, though Myrtle would be happy to swap her turn (April and May) to a turn that is not in lambing time.

Similarly, we have lost the churchyard team due to ill health. Brain and Brenda have done a sterling job for many years but can no longer manage it, nor can Roger due to an injury. It would be a good thing if we could set up a rota of men who could keep the top end of the churchyard looking tidy between the rows of graves. You don't have to be a churchgoer, just someone who cares about our village's bit of Heritage and its future.
