THE CIRCUIT

We have had a further couple of queries from local villages to ask if their village defibrillator is registered on 'The Circuit', a national defibrillator network.

The Circuit connects defibrillators to the NHS ambulance services across the UK so that in those crucial moments after a cardiac arrest, they can be accessed quickly to help save lives. As defibrillators are registered on The Circuit, their location and status are instantly synchronised with the emergency services' systems ensuring that their information is always up to date and ready to help save lives.

WACFR have registered and continue to update status on a monthly basis all of the twelve defibrillators that are based within our community.




We had a brief discussion too about our plans to celebrate King Charles' Coronation & agreed that we'd like to hold a Big Lunch in the village on 7th May.
